## Airspace dispute ends

The construction of Standley Lake High School will begin soon, without any of the delays feared over a dispute over an aviation easement.

With little comment, the Jefferson County Board of Education last month agreed to the easement, somewhat modified, giving the Jefferson County Airport Authority authority over airspace above the high school site at West 104th Avenue and Wadsworth Parkway.

Saying it could allow aircraft to hover directly over the school, the board previously had balked at approving the aviation easement and instead ordered school officials to begin condemnation proceedings on the land.

Talks between the district and airport authority since have led to the authority's modifying the easement so the district can insist on Federal Aviation Administration regulations being followed over the school, said board member Glen Keller.

The school district also received a letter from the FAA assuring the school district that the building of the school on that site would present "no substantial health hazard or hazard from noise and vibrations to students in the school."

The condemnation proceedings initiated on the land also were dropped.
